Reading Activity: 'The Zoo Vet'

Attached below is an e-book all about zoo animals! This story is called, 'The Zoo Vet'. If you would like to hear this story read aloud by Miss Dix then log onto your Seesaw account!

Here are some key questions to think about whilst reading this story with an adult - what do you think this story will be about and why do you think this? What are the key events of the story? How does it end? What does a vet do? Why are they important? Have you ever been poorly before or had to look after somebody that was poorly? What did you do to help them?

After reading the story, 'The Zoo Vet', can you make your own stick puppets for some of the animals in the story? You might want to draw, paint or even craft these! Think about some of the materials that you may have around the house, such as paper plates, cardboard, string etc and see how you can use these in a creative way. Once you have made your puppets, can you use these to retell parts of the story of 'The Zoo Vet' to an adult or sibling in your own words?



Phonics Activity: Recapping the 'st' blend


For today's lesson, we will be recapping one of our Phase 4 clusters and blends! Warm Up Activity: Spot the odd one out!

Here are some lines of rhyming words. Rhyming words are two or more words that have the same or similar ending sound. Some examples of rhyming words are: goat, boat, moat, float. When you are figuring out if two words rhyme, listen carefully as you say the words. If they sound the same or similar at the end, they rhyme. Can you circle the odd word out in each line?

Teach Phase: I can say the 'st' blend.

Today we are going to be recapping the 'st' blend in our Phase 4 sounds. Login to Seesaw to hear how we pronounce this blend. Let's take a look at some words that have the 'st' blend at the beginning and the end of them! Can you sound each one out?












Maths Activity: Subtracting Amounts Using a Number Line






