The whole school will have a celebratory picnic lunch in the playground together with music plus the option of accessing a quiet room if this is preferred by the children.


Comic Relief Red Nose Day – Friday 17th March:

Article 17 You have the right to get information that is important to your wellbeing, from radio, newspapers, books, computers, and other sources. Adults should make sure that the information you are getting is not harmful, and they should help you to find and understand

St Helier Repair Café (reminder):

Janvrin School will be hosting the St. Helier Repair Cafe every month. A repair cafe is a place for people to come along to get faulty and broken belongings fixed for free.
