for the children.


There where so many cakes provided a second cake sale was held. Thank you for your contributions the cake sale added to a lovely celebration feel for the day.

We look to the next steps and the way forward as the new syllabus for RE is rolled out across all schools.




Summer Reading Challenge:

Last year, in Jersey, over 2,000 children joined the Challenge.

How it works:

- Children sign up through their local library and receive a collector folder.
- They borrow 6 books of their choice during the summer, collecting special stickers and incentives.
- Library staff and volunteers help children to discover new books that suit their interests and reading level and run a programme of free themed activities in the library.
- Children who complete their Challenge are presented with a certificate, a medal and a complimentary Aquasplash swim pass each.

St Helier Repair Café (reminder):
