Appointments:

Please be aware that if your child has an appointment we do need to see a copy of the appointment letter or the text reminder that was sent confirming the date and time. School attendance is mandatory and as such I need to ensure that registers are kept as an accurate document, absences including those to attend appointments must be noted. I appreciate your support with this.

Attendance Policy:

Just as a reminder the department expectations are as follows:

95% and above is the minimum expected attendance

95%-91% attendance and punctuality is concerning - school to monitor, consider appropriateness of an attendance plan 90%-86% school to initiate an attendance plan, consider Family Support Worker involvement, Early Help or EBNA assessment 85% school to inform parents/carers that a request for involvement of the Educational Welfare Team will be submitted. 85% attendance equates to 29 days of school missed, that is approximately 6 weeks and equals 180 missed lessons.

Summer Reading Challenge:

Last year, in Jersey, over 2,000 children joined the Challenge.

How it works:



- They borrow 6 books of their choice during the summer, collecting special stickers and incentives.
- Library staff and volunteers help children to discover new books that suit their interests and reading level and run a programme of free themed activities in the library.
- Children who complete their Challenge are presented with a certificate, a medal and a complimentary Aquasplash swim pass each.
